

Healthy Neighborhoods Readiness Assessment SCORING

Once the Neighborhood Task Force completes the readiness assessment, the POC either independently or with the task force can score their readiness. Below are instructions.

Community Need	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. How did you determine community need? 2. What data sources did you use? 3. What did the data suggest? 4. Was the data broken down by state, county or zip code? 	<p>No data sources – 0</p> <p>Anecdotal evidence but little data – 10</p> <p>3 or more sources which accurately supports defined community need - 20</p>	
Research on Evidence-Based Models	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. How did you select the initiative? 2. Did you research evidence-based or evidence-informed models? Please list the models you researched. 3. How will these models be adapted to meet the needs of your target population? 	<p>No research – 0</p> <p>Some research – 10</p> <p>3 or more models that address similar need with target population and has adaptations - 20</p>	
Community Buy-In	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Do you have community support for initiative? 2. How did you obtain community support? 3. Name community members who helped inform initiative who represent the target population. 4. Name community organization who serve the target population who helped inform initiative. 	<p>No community support – 0</p> <p>Only members of task force that represent organizations that target population – 10</p> <p>Have either recruited target population to be a part of the task force or have received significant feedback - 20</p>	
Budget	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. How did you decide the budget? 2. How did you decide which organization is best to implement initiative? 3. Did you align with other initiatives or other resources (can include in-kind support)? 4. How will this effort be sustained past funding? 	<p>No budget yet – 0</p> <p>Budget not well crafted with little knowledge of other initiatives – 10</p> <p>Detailed budget that is aligned with other efforts with some thoughts on sustainability - 20</p>	
Outcomes	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. What outcomes are you expecting? By when? 2. Do you have a logic model, that defines short-term, intermediate and long-term outcomes? 3. How will you track and measure outcomes? What data will you use? 4. Who will complete the interim and final reports? 	<p>No outcomes yet created - -0</p> <p>Some anticipated outcomes outlined with possible data sources – 10</p> <p>Logic model in place; data sources identified with entity agreeing to complete reports - 20</p>	

Three buckets of readiness:

0 – 60: Not ready; will need significant technical assistance.

61 – 90: Almost ready; need some technical assistance

91 – 100: ready; can move to sounding board.
